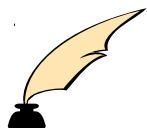

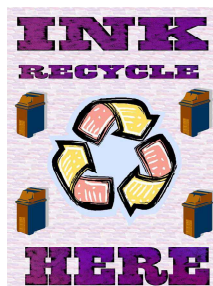
First Reading: Ecclesiastes 1:2, 2:21-23
